



# TRIP PLANNER/SIEM REAP, CAMBODIA



Fly to Bangkok with Thai Air from Bangalore (Rs20,000, round-trip tickets, including taxes), Delhi (Rs29,000) and Mumbai (Rs20,000). From Bangkok, take a Bangkok Air ([www.bangkokair.com](http://www.bangkokair.com)) flight to Siem Reap, fares, inclusive of taxes, from Rs10,000 one-way. You can get a visa on arrival at Siem Reap for \$20 (around Rs980)

 **Shinta Mani** ([www.shintamani.com](http://www.shintamani.com)) has consistently good reviews and double rooms for upwards of Rs5,000. **The FCC Angkor** ([www.fcccambodia.com/angkor](http://www.fcccambodia.com/angkor)) is also highly spoken of in discerning circles. With rooms for around Rs7,000, it has a fabulous collection of John McDermott's photographs of a sepia-tinted Cambodia. Closer to the Angkor complex, there's Palm Village ([www.palmvillage.com.kh](http://www.palmvillage.com.kh)), for upwards of Rs1,500 a night.

 Both **Shinta Mani** and the **FCC Angkor** have excellent in-house restaurants. **Blue Pumpkin café** ([www.tbpumpkin.com](http://www.tbpumpkin.com)) serving international cuisine, is another favourite. Their main outlet is near the old market, off Pub Street. (Tip: Go past the diners on the ground floor on to the mezzanine floor for relaxed lounge seating.) For authentic Khmer and Thai food, Chao Praya on the road to Angkor Wat is highly recommended.
